




Internship Data: past 6 semesters' graduates, undergrads only




21.3% of CSBS students interacted with Career & Professional Development Center

CPDC engages students in classroom presentations and assignments.

Graduates who have had helpful career development experiences are 5.8 times more likely to say their university prepared them for life outside of college (Gallup, 2017).
